

Repellents, Dog and Insect



1. Scope

This standard covers the requirements for repellents for both insects and dogs.
This standard applies to the Seattle City Light (SCL) stock numbers cited in section 6.

2. Application

Dog repellent is for spraying in the direction of an aggressive dog's face to deter attacks.
Insect repellent is applied to a person's skin to repel mosquitoes, ticks, gnats, biting flies, and other insects.

3. Requirements

Product requirements shall be as described in Section 6.

4. Packaging

Product shall be packaged to prevent damage during shipping, handling, and inside storage.

Individual packages shall be legibly marked with:

- Manufacturer name
- Manufacturer catalog number
- Product description
- Seattle City Light stock number
